FIZZ

1. Prosecco Frizzante dei Colli, San Simone, Italy £20

Gentle floral bouquet with soft gentle bubbles, light in body and elegantly fruity on the finish.

2. Maillart Brut Premier Cru NV, France £45

A truly remarkable champagne from a small, family owned vineyard, elegant with an exquisite delicate balance on the palate.

WHITE

3. Sauvignon Blanc, Santa Ema, Maipo Valley, £16

2012, Chile

Wonderfully crisp with intense citrus notes, hints of fresh apple and pears and a tantalising finish.

4. Chardonnay, La Doutelle, 2013, France £17

An easy-drinking, fruit-driven Chardonnay, produced in a New World style, delivering plenty of tropical fruit with a creamy finish.

5. Pinot Grigio, Villa Molino Della Venezie IGT, £19

2013, Italy

Straw in colour with light golden hues, it has a fruity bouquet and a subtle, fresh flavour.

6. Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough, Three Stones, £22

2014, New Zealand

Crisp lime, kiwi and passion fruit on the palate with touches of fresh gooseberry. A deliciously opulent, tantalising wine.

7. Rully Premier Cru 'Les Cloux', Roche de £32

Bellene, 2011, Burgundy, France

From outstanding young winemaker, Nicolas Potel, this is refined and well rounded with flinty notes. Superb with fish and shellfish.

ROSÉ

8. Domaine Saint Geniès Menestrol Rosé 2012, France £18

A gutsy, Provence style rosé with a full palate of creamy, soft summer berry fruits - it is simply delicious.

RED

9. Cabernet Sauvignon, Santa Ema, Maipo Valley, 2012, Chile £16

Ripe blackberry and plum aromas and flavours with delicious touches of toasty oak.

10. La Doutelle, Merlot, 2013, France £17

A fruity yet earthy wine that can be enjoyed with food or on its own. Round and well balanced with a smooth finish

11. Pinotage, Franschoek Cellar 2012, South Africa £19

Vibrant ruby red in colour with mulberry and plum flavours, hints of spice and chocolate and a full, soft finish.

12. Vina Amate, Rioja Crianza 2011, Spain £20

A smooth and vibrant Rioja with rich, fruity flavours. Fruit, oak and spice in perfect harmony.

13. Shiraz Cabernet, Angove 2012, Australia £25

Raspberry and plum characters abound on the nose. A complex palate of dark red fruits is complemented by subtle oak. Juicy, fresh and smooth.
